The Shire of Kalamunda / Perth Solar City Project

The Shire of Kalamunda have been working with EMRC to deliver two projects under the Perth Solar City Program. The project installation is being funded by both the Australian Government through Perth Solar City and the Shire of Kalamunda. The Shire has one project at their Administration building and one at the Kalamunda Library.

The Shire of Kalamunda Administration Building is located at 2 Railway Road, Kalamunda and houses 95 staff who supports the Kalamunda Council to undertake all relevant Shire business. The administration building was originally built in 1974 and includes the original lighting system which is now considered to be extremely inefficient. The lighting system reflects the age of the building making the building a significant energy user. On average, the existing energy usage is approximately 1483 GJ of energy per annum, costing the Shire approximately \$65,000 per annum to run and generating significant amounts of greenhouse gas emissions. The Shire is aiming for an initial reduction in energy use of by up to 20% and a reduction in its annual greenhouse gas emissions with approximately 73 tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent. An initial cost saving of up to \$13,000 is expected to be achievable; with the payback period, using current utility costs, being within 6 years.

With the installation of Energy Reduction, Demand Management System and retrofits for the Administration Building, the Shire of Kalamunda will be able to report on:

- Reduction in kWh per annum;
- Greenhouse abatement (T-eCO2 p.a.),
- Financial Savings (\$ p.a.) – which will help determine payback periods, and
- Community Engagement (e.g. No. of visitors, tours etc).

Additional features of the system will include a scrolling LCD visual display screen mounted in the reception area, which will display the historical results of the implementation of the system to the general public. Individual staff will also have the capacity to monitor their personal contribution to the buildings energy consumption in real time which will be achieved through a display installed upon every personal desktop computer.

The LCD Screen and software will learn the behavioural patterns of the building and aim towards an efficiency target point.

The Shire currently has four power-mates available for the community to loan, which are available from the Kalamunda Library to take home and use. The power-mate can determine specific energy consumption in the household and encourage people to change their behaviour and reduce energy consumption.

The next stage of the project aims to engage the Community to:

- Provide meaningful, educational and learning opportunities at the local demonstration projects;
- Increase the community's understanding and knowledge of how to use energy appropriately along with the benefits of solar technology; and
- Encourage positive energy use behaviour and uptake of solar technologies.

The second project will be completed at the Kalamunda Library in September 2011. In the near future a roof mounted wind turbine and PV system will be visible, the Shire will provide further details once the project has been completed.

2011 Climate Change Adaptation Champions Program Finalist Award

ECMP – Eastern Catchment Management Plan

Background

There continues to be considerable passion and community commitment to catchment management in the Eastern Hills region. Enthusiasm led to the development of the Swan-Mundaring Integrated Catchment Management Plan (ICMP) in 2000, which was used extensively by Catchment Groups and Local Governments in the region.

What do we have now?

The existing Catchment Management Plan (2000) is comprehensive and has an integrated catchment management focus. However, the plan is over ten years old and there have been considerable changes to natural resource management since its development.

What changes has there been?

There have been changes to coordination and administration of natural resource management programs, funding and changes in policy and legislation. There are also issues that now require a stronger focus, including climate change, bush care and bushfire integration, urban development in catchment areas and indigenous cultural heritage.

What is being done now?

The East Reference Group is aware of these changes and believes that the existing ICMP needs to be reviewed and modernised to keep abreast of the opportunities and challenges facing natural resource management in the region.

The drafting of an Eastern Catchment Management Plan provides an opportunity to evaluate and focus on achievements to date and also identify opportunities for brokering partnerships with key stakeholders to ensure effective integrated catchment management in the region.



What has happened so far?

- Established a Working Group to oversee the project - the Working Group is made up of Officers from Shires of Kalamunda and Mundaring, City of Swan, Eastern Hills Catchment Management Program, and the Swan River Trust, Chair of Eastern Hills Catchment Management Program, members of Jane Brook Catchment Group and supported by Perth Region NRM.
- Collated documents for a literature review (Background/History).
- Interviewed those involved with the original ICMP.
- Have developed the purpose and scope of the revised Plan.
- Defined the stakeholders.
- Identified key issues to be included in the plan through a community survey.
- Employed a consultant to assist the building of a Community Engagement Plan.

What Now?

The next steps are to engage with those groups currently undertaking on-ground work to find out how the East Reference Group and the Eastern Catchment Management Plan can best support this on-ground work. The ECMP is a key strategic document that can assist groups to attract investment into the region – we just need to know from the community how this is best addressed.

How can YOU be involved?

- Learning about what's happening.
- Discussing the ECMP with your EHCMP Officer.
- Providing feedback to the East Reference Group.
- Thinking about what you have done on ground and how this plan can help in the next 5 – 10 years.
- Attend any workshops on the ECMP.

The ECMP Document is a living working document that will become the main action plan for catchment management in the eastern region. It is important that all volunteers who are involved in "their patch" have a say.

Groundwater Replenishment Trial

Community awareness and discussion about the Groundwater Replenishment Trial continues to grow as the people of Perth demonstrate they have a keen interest in the future of their water supply.

The three year trial, which involves further treating treated wastewater to drinking water standards and recharging it to groundwater, is now well underway and community engagement and support are integral to its success and are a key focus for the project team.

Public tours of the Advanced Water Recycling Plant and Visitor Centre are available as part of an extensive community and stakeholder engagement program to build awareness and knowledge of groundwater replenishment. Helena River Picnic Grounds Planting Day



Members of the Helena River Catchment Group were joined by over 35 volunteers on Sunday, 20 June 2011 to plant 3,000 trees at the picnic grounds on Helena Valley Road. The day was a great success due to the combined efforts of local residents, representatives of Western Power, Perth Region NRM, Lower Helena Association and Bassendean Preservation Group. The mammoth task of planting 3,000 local native provenance species was achieved in little over two hours.

The previous day's rain paved the way for a perfect planting day for the volunteers. Family groups with children as young as three years of age and senior citizens all got their hands dirty for the cause. After the hard work the troupe enjoyed a light lunch provided by volunteers.



City of Swan "Rural Properties Revegetation Program"

On Saturday, 19 June 2011, the City of Swan (CoS) through the "Rural Properties Revegetation Program", gave away over 8,500 plants to over 200 residents of the city. This popular program focuses on the revegetation of rural properties over 10,000 m² within the region. The program is an important initiative implemented by the city.

The CoS engaged Men of the Trees (Inc) (MoTT) to especially grow 9,000 trees, shrubs and groundcovers to compliment the City's natural environment. "Men of the Trees" is a non profit organisation, staffed by volunteers committed to growing plants for the betterment of the environment.

The wet and windy day ran like clockwork, a testament to the meticulous organisation by Jennifer Williams (CoS) and the knowledgeable staff of MoTT, who were on hand to assist residents to select the appropriate plant species for their site.



The EMRC marquee provided information on Catchment group activities, Eastern Hills Catchment Management Program (EHCMP) services and events, as well as providing an opportunity to shelter from the rain.

Residents were given the opportunity to enter a draw for a free trailer load of mulch from EMRC's Red Hill waste management facility. The mulch comprises of greenwaste collected from Council verge collections, greenwaste bins, transfer stations, commercial customers and local residents which is then composted according to strict standards. In fact the EMRC runs the only local government facility in Australia with Australian Standard AS4454 (composts, soil conditioners and mulches). The winner of the mulch has been notified and a voucher will be issued shortly.

Community Action Grants now open

Community groups can now apply for small grants to help fund local environmental and sustainable agriculture projects.

Parliamentary Secretary for Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry Dr Mike Kelly has announced that \$5 million will be available through the 2011-12 Community Action Grants round.

Grants of between \$5,000 and \$20,000 are available to help local community groups undertake activities such as revegetating landscapes, removing weeds, controlling pests, holding field days and improving sustainable land management practices.

Since Community Action Grants were announced in 2009, 877 projects have received funding worth more than \$15 million.

Applications for the 2011-12 Community Action Grants round will close Monday 1 August 2011.

Plant of the Month

Hovea chorizemifolia - Holly-leaved Hovea

Spectacular in flower, the Holly-leaved Hovea is an erect, slender and prickly shrub which occurs on a variety of soil types, including; sand, gravel, laterite and granite.

Hovea species mark the start of the flowering season in the Eastern Hills. Hovea flowers are generally purple with a white 'eye'. They are members of the Fabaceae or pea family. The species is unique to the South West
