With the Equine Influenza outbreak in August 2007 many horse owners were left in the dark as to what was happening and how they could best protect their horses in the event of a disease outbreak or equine emergency in WA.

When a disease or equine emergency happens, it is important that you receive ongoing information from a reliable source, as it happens.

The Equine Influenza crisis in Australia identified the need for an effective method of sharing and disseminating emergency information to the non regulated horse industry in WA.

The WA Equine Influenza Information Group (WAEIIG) requested the Western Australian Horse Council (WAHC) develop and maintain a contact list for communicating horse emergency information to the non racing sector of the horse industry.

This comprehensive contact database includes key communicators in the equestrian governing bodies, associations, clubs, feed merchants, equine businesses and service providers, who will in turn be asked to forward the information to their members and customers.

Individual horse owners can also receive this information direct and are invited to add their details to the database.

The information supplied for the database is private and only used for the dissemination of updating the progress of an Emergency Disease, quarantine regulations and bio-security information.

Funding for the WAECL database and website was provided by the Dept. of Racing, Gaming and Liquor.
